Should a power bank be charged first?

Depending on the charge level, you can start using them immediately or charge them first instead. While there is no set rule, it's okay to let the power bank's battery level reach around 20% before you charge it. Is charging a power bank a bad idea?

Should I charge my power bank 100%?

Can you leave a power bank charging overnight?

In most cases, leaving your power bank charging overnight should be fine. Like many other batteries, modern power banks have built-in circuits that detect when they've reached the maximum charge. Once the battery is full, the circuit cuts the power source. This is true even if the power bank remains plugged into a power source.
