What percentage of Peru's Electricity is generated by solar PV?

Solar PV accounted for 3% of Peru's total installed power generation capacity and 2% of total power generation in 2023.

How much electricity does Peru generate?

The gross electricity generation in Peru is currently around 30.9 TWh based on an installed generation capacity of 7.2 GW, with a maximum confirmed demand of 4.3 GW, including energy exports to neighboring countries.

What is the solar PV market in Peru?

What type of electricity is used in Peru?

Renewable electricity here is the sum of hydropower, wind, solar, geothermal, modern biomass and wave and tidal power. Traditional biomass - the burning of charcoal, crop waste, and other organic matter - is not included. This can be an important source in lower-income settings. How many solar and wind projects are there in Peru?

Peru has around 4 GW of solar and wind projects under development. The Ministry of Energy and Mines (MINEM) is in charge of the energy sector, through three main Directorates: the General Directorate of Hydrocarbons (DGH), the General Directorate of Electricity (DGE), and the General Directorate of Mines (DGM).

What happened to Peru's energy sector?

Go to Top Peru's energy sector was privatised in the 1990s and concessions were granted for power generation, transmission and distribution. Nevertheless, the Peruvian government still maintains an important position within the sector.
