

Photovoltaic solar panel prices in Spain

How much does a photovoltaic system cost in Spain?

If we take into account that a typical household consumes around 4.4 kW, the initial cost of a project of these characteristics in Spain would be around EUR6,500 (plus VAT). However, having said that, the price of a photovoltaic system can vary greatly depending on different factors. The amount of energy you need is only one of these.

How much do solar panels cost in Spain?

For installations of less than 10 kWp, the most common for homes, the amount can reach up to EUR600 per kWp. If you add a battery, you get a subsidy of EUR490 per kWh. Income Tax Deduction (IRPF). For the installation of solar panels in Spain, a discount of 20% to 60% can be obtained. This percentage varies depending on the autonomous communities.

How much does a solar self-consumption photovoltaic installation cost in Spain?

The price of a solar self-consumption photovoltaic installation for a single-family home is around EUR1,500 for each kilowatt generated (taxes not included). If we take into account that a typical household consumes around 4.4 kW, the initial cost of a project of these characteristics in Spain would be around EUR6,500 (plus VAT).

How much does a photovoltaic system cost?

The former cost between EUR115 and EUR220, without taking into account the assembly costs or the structure. If a house requires at least 3 kW to cover its energy consumption during certain hours of the day, it will need at least 6 panels of 450w. The cost to purchase these photovoltaic panels will be around EUR1,300 (excluding taxes).
