What are the fire codes for battery energy storage systems?

The model fire codes outline essential safety requirements for both safeguarding Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) and ensuring the protection of individuals. It is strongly advised to include the items listed in the Battery Safety Requirements table (Fig 3) in your Hazardous Mitigation Plan (HMP) for the battery system.

Should energy storage systems be protected by NFPA 13?

According to the Fire Protection Research Foundation of the US National Fire Department in June 2019, the first energy storage system nozzle research based on UL-based tests was released. Currently, the energy storage system needs to be protected by the NFPA 13 sprinkler system as required.
